UPCOMING PRESENTATIONS AND EVENTS

December 2 & 3: Historic Burlington's Christmas at the Museum. Dr. Paul Tenkotte: Germans in Northern Kentucky, 7pm Thursday, November 17

The Boone County Historical Society is pleased to welcome Paul A. Tenkotte, Ph.D, for his presentation entitled *More than Beer, Brats and Polka: Germans in Northern Kentucky*. The event is cosponsored by the Boone Co. Public Library, and is free and open to the public.

Dr. Tenkotte is Professor of History and Director of the Center for Public History at Northern Kentucky University. He is a frequent speaker on regional topics and has co-edited, with colleagues, three recent books including the 450-page *Gateway City: Covington, Kentucky, 1815-2015* (Clerisy Press, 2015), the 250-page *Cincinnati: The Queen City* (Cincinnati Museum Center, 2014), and the 1,048-page *Encyclopedia of Northern Kentucky* (University Press of Kentucky, 2009). He has authored or edited hundreds of newspaper and journal articles, and been a con-



sultant to more than a dozen public television documentaries, including the Regional Emmy-Award-winning *Where the River Bends: A History of Northern Kentucky* (2007) and *Sacred Spaces of Greater Cincinnati* (2008). His project was to improve the condition of the Graves-Duncan Cemetery in Hebron. A total of \$144 was collected at that meeting to help Joseph with some of his expenses.

The Boone County Chapter of the D.A.R. and the Simon Kenton Chapter S.A.R. have invited our members to attend a Patriot Grave Marking Ceremony honoring Revolutionary War Captain John Graves (Joseph's 6th Great Grandfather), and a celebration of this young man's excellent accomplishments.

The invitation appears at the right. This ancient cemetery happens to be located in the back yard of one of the homes in the Tree Tops Subdivision, and the current owners have



graciously agreed to provide access for the ceremony. If you intend to go, please be aware of the parking limitations.

The Boone County Historical Society will be filming the ceremony and copies of the resulting DVD will be placed in the Boone County Public Library so everyone will be able to view this very special event.

The Boone County Historical Society provides program meetings at 7pm on the third Thursday evenings of January, March, May, July, September and November.

Meetings (except for July) are held at the Boone County Public Library, Main Library, 1786 Burlington Pike, Burlington, Kentucky. July "out-and-about" meetings are held at various locations around the County.

The Society hosts a number of exhibits at the BCHS Museum (*see page 3*) each year. Most items for these exhibits are borrowed on a temporary basis from our members and friends, and do not belong to the Society. We greatly appreciate being entrusted with these loaned items that relate to our exhibits.

have been donated by individuals and families who desire to share with others items of historical significance to Boone County. Their generosity is gratefully appreciated.
